Presently, we have 21 students learning at home due to "close contact" quarantines. A fair portion of those students (13, I believe) are cleared by the Health Department to return to school on Friday, October 23.

At this time, I feel we can continue to offer in-person instruction and our online distance learning.

In addition to these numbers, within our building we currently have seven staff members on quarantine (two teachers, five support staff). We have four students currently on quarantine as well.

In accordance with the State Mandate issued on the evening of Sunday, November 15, starting today (Wednesday, November 18) Carney-Nadeau Public School has transitioned all students in grades 9-12 exclusively to online learning. Students in grades K-8 can still attend in person instruction each school day. As per the plan we formulated in response to the letter from the local Health Department that all schools in Menominee and Delta counties received last week, our school is closed for in-person instruction during the entire week of Thanksgiving (Nov 23-27) The current state order extends through December 8th. We will of course follow it until it expires barring any additional changes or unforeseen circumstances.

Within the school, as of today (12-9-20) we have no staff members who are either out with COVID themselves or who have been identified as the close contact of someone who does. We currently have nine students who are quarantined due to being named as close contacts.

In accordance with the directives issued on Monday, December 7 by the State Health Department, we will continue to offer in-person instruction on a daily basis to all students in grades K-8. Students in grades 9-12 will continue to do distance learning from home. The order that they do so is set to expire on December 20. As we have previously announced, all students will be distance learning on December 21-22, so, in effect, high school students will not be able to return to the classroom until after Christmas Break on January 4 (and, indeed, the current order could very well be extended between now and then.
