Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2024-25 educational progress for Carney-Nadeau Public School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Carney-Nadeau Public School has not been identified as a Targeted Support and Improvement, Additional Targeted Support, or Comprehensive Support and Improvement School.

CNPS continues to strive toward ensuring the academic success and sound mental and physical health of each and every student. As is true of most public schools across the state—if not the nation—we endured a decline in student performance and attendance in the months that followed students return to school from the statewide pandemic shutdown. Since then, though, we have taken numerous steps to support our students' progress and better serve their needs, including but not limited to: implementing a new reading curriculum ("Bookworms") in grades K-8, implementing a new math curriculum ("Open Up Math") in grades K-11, hiring an Assistant Superintendent, integrating social emotional learning into our daily health curriculums for all students, utilizing Youth Empowering Services for supplemental SEL instruction, training our elementary staff on



both Orton Gillingham and LTRS systems of literacy instruction, banning the use of cell phones during the school day, and administering a multitude of annual assessments (NWEA three times per year, Accadience twice per year, practice PSAT/SAT twice per year) to monitor student progress. While there remains much work yet to be done, our most recent assessment and state index scores respectively attest to our school's progress.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

1. **PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL**--The CNPS school district consists of two separate schools: Carney-Nadeau Public School and Phoenix Alternative High School. Students in grades K-8 enrolled in our district are placed into the former school. Students in grades 9-12 (or, more accurately, the parents and guardians thereof) have the option to attend either of our schools. Those students in need of make-up core curriculum credits are inclined to choose Phoenix.
2. **THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN**—Since 2022, CNPS has adhered to the MICIP model for school improvement. We have formulated a MICIP team consisting of administrators and teachers from the high school, junior high, elementary, and special education levels that in addition to quarterly meetings with our MICIP Coordinator, meets on a monthly basis to discuss the plan's progress and any need for adjustments. We are in year 4 of our five-year plan, and thus far, CNPS has completed all necessary components of this MICIP report.
