- A. December Dates to Remember – Christmas Program 12-17-25, Staff Lunch 12-17-25, Special Board Meeting 12-18-25.
- B. Main Entrance Flower Beds – Received 2% grants for chrome books & Friday afternoon school counselor pay. Mr. Cocco said he would like to take on the flower bed project, free labor, re-use the landscape stones and the school would only need to purchase additional landscape stones to finish the project. The board will pause on the flower bed project.
- C. Football Co-Op – Spoke to two local schools about the possible Football Co-Op. NCA declined and SAPS would like to talk further on the subject. Will set up a meeting with SAPS.
- D. Playground Fence – Discussed playground fence extension with a large rolling gate opening to alleviate elementary students from running near the road. Quoted @ \$2,050. Could use snow fence as a temporary solution.
- E. Operational Fund Millage Restoration Pursuit – May 2026 or November 2026 elections are the two options to place this millage restoration back on the ballot. If we choose the May election, it would be the only item on the ballot and election fees would be higher. If we choose the November election, the township is also pursuing a millage request.
