 - A. The Finance Committee reviewed all the bills, recommended the bills to be paid and approved the minutes of the 2/25/26 meeting. Discussed the following expenses: Bowling Field Trip, Battery Charger, snow plowing, PTO concessions and game worker pay.

 - B. Elementary SE Report: 1% Justification – IQ of 70 or less, the state has now decreased it to an IQ of 62. Will be meeting to decide on the Mild CI Classroom for next school year. 35m grant award very specific.

- VIII. Discussion Items:
 - A. Steve Kedsch, Coaching Retirement – Steve was the Varsity Volleyball Coach for 25 years and has decided he does not want to return. We are currently looking for a new Varsity VB Coach.

 - B. Counting Certain Bay College Dual Enrollment Classes as Satisfying Courses in the Michigan Merit Curriculum – If a student takes a foreign language course @ Bay, could that count as a required high school course? Mr. Cocco feels that a required course should be a 2-semester course, especially if the

curriculums are similar.

- C. Sports Co-Op Meeting #2 with Stephenson - SAPS is concerned about a football co-op causing them to move up a division in MHSAA if there were a number of our students joining their team. They would be open to a co-op with their JV Football Team. We will be meeting with them again 4-9-26.
- D. Career Counseling/Student Supports/Life Skills – Help with graduated students that feel lost in college, a possible follow-up a year after graduation when the surveys are done with former students. Would need someone trained in Career Development.

K. Kasbohm - if our students already played Varsity Football, can they play on SAPS JV Team, is there an MHSAA rule about that? Is Dual Enrollment holding kids credits hostage? Can we bring back CNBA? Teach the fundamentals and let the kids play against each other.

J. Polfus – We don't have a HS Guidance Counselor, is there anyone at CNPS that could take that on? As a small school, we should have every available option for our students since we aren't able to offer all the classes that larger school can offer.

K. Kleiman – Could high school students also use Michigan Virtual for required courses?

D. Lampinen – SAPS is a well-oiled machine in sports due to teaching the fundamentals in elementary and using the Sharks program as a feeder for HS football. Same with basketball, starting when they are little. Will our parents want to travel everyday to SAPS if we co-op for Football? Have we discussed starting a Sharks program here at CNPS?
