1. What was the total amount of the district's Section 31a allocation for the 2025-26 School Year?

For the 2025-26 school year, Carney-Nadeau Public School received \$256,952.65 in 31a funds.

2. Describe the district's methodology and decision-making for distributing Section 31a At-Risk grant funds to target the buildings with the highest needs

Carney-Nadeau Public School is a single building district. Our administration works in coordination with our school board, business manager, and staff to utilize these funds in service to the grade-levels and disciplines that pose the greatest level of need.

3. What evidence-based interventions and services were implemented with the Section 31a At-Risk grant funds during the 2025-26 Grant Cycle? We utilize Reward, Phoenix for Reading, Orton Gillingham Comprehensive, Morphology, and Social Emotional Learning programs such as TRAILS and Student Mental Health First Aid.

Letters are mailed to parents as students are entered into the above-mentioned programs that request their feedback and provide contact information should they have any questions. As the year progresses, parents are sent progress monitoring updates containing this same solicitation request and contact information. Feedback is also gathered directly at parent/teacher conferences. Lastly, letters are sent when students exit the programs and we request feedback from parents regarding their opinions on their child's performance and the programs effectiveness as a whole.



5. Describe the method parents or legal guardians may use to provide feedback on the use of these funds. Parents or legal guardians are repeatedly made aware, through the letters described above and other means that they may email applicable staff members at any time or may call and schedule an appointment during regular business hours, which, during the school year, run from 6:00 am – 5:30 pm
